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Windley Key Fossil Reef Geological State Park, located on Islamorada, Florida, was in the early 1900s the site of a quarry that furnished coral used in the construction of an overseas railroad connecting Florida to the Keys. Today, many broken pieces of coral are strewn about the wooded area that adjoins the quarry site. They seemed to have been tossed at random, and have taken on a life of their own as a kind of impromptu sculpture garden. Visitors' own imaginations can find a myriad of forms in the coral detritus, which changes with the light and mood on any given day.


